Working on SPI Action Plans

- Describe the problem, the data and analysis that led to its identification
- Describe the strategies and tactics planned (to date) to address the problem
- Develop a logic model that identifies the resources, activities, outputs, and short- and long-term impacts anticipated
- Include an impact evaluation plan

Working on SPI Action Plans (cont.)

- Ensure that the research partner is included in all project phases
- Demonstrate executive support and commitment of agency resources to the project
- Address issues of integration and sustainability
