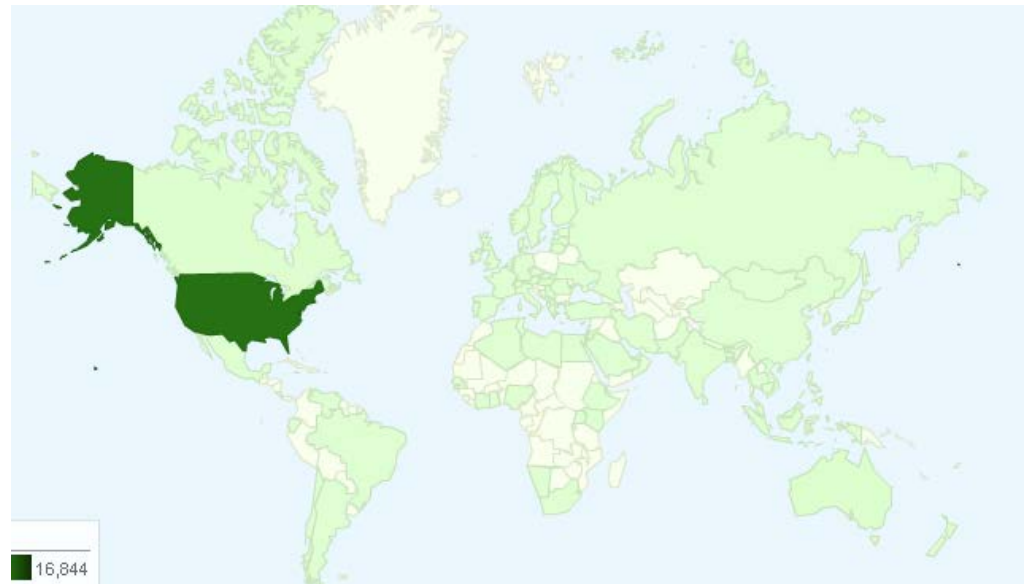

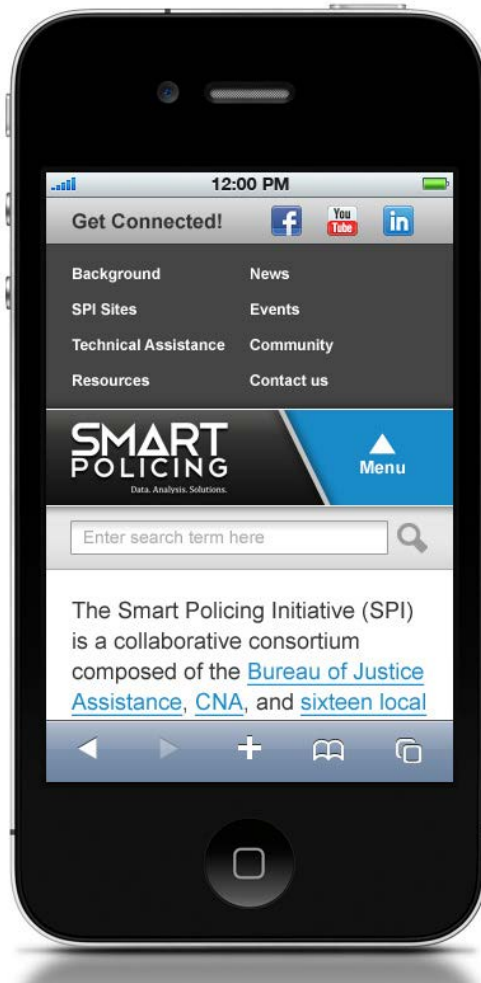

SPI SITE SPOTLIGHT REPORT - BOSTON, MA  <p>From 2004 to 2008, the city of Boston experienced notable increases in violent crime, especially robberies and assaults committed with guns. In response, Commissioner Edward Davis developed the Safe Street Team (SST) strategy through which police officer teams were assigned to 13 different violent crime hot spots. The SST's applied problem-oriented, community-policing strategies to identify and address recurring problems in their target areas.</p> <p>In 2009, the Boston Police Department received funding from the Bureau of Justice Assistance's Smart Policing Initiative to conduct an external, fact-based evaluation of the place-based SST strategy.
